The Ticket to Work and Self-Sufficiency is a voluntary program.

When you assign your Ticket to an Employment Network or sign up with Vocational Rehabilitation (VR), you're agreeing to work with them to find a job. Social Security will not medically review your case if your Ticket is in assignment and you are making progress toward your goal.

What is Ticket to Work (TTW)?

Ticket to Work (TTW) is a voluntary Social Security program that can help you find a job.

How does the TTW program work?

When you assign your TTW to an Employment Network (EN, which includes the Maine Career Centers) you're agreeing to work with them to find a job earning at least \$850 a month, and eventually \$1,180 a month or more. It's free because Social Security pays the EN when your earnings reach these amounts for a certain length of time.

What is an Employment Network (EN)?

An EN is an organization that contracts with Social Security to help people who receive SSI or Title II (SSDI, CDB, or DWB) benefits with finding and keeping a job. The EN can work with you to develop a job goal, write a resume, learn interviewing skills, help you apply for jobs, and help you keep your job. Will the EN accept my TTW?

ENs are not required to accept your TTW. An EN will decide based largely on whether or not you plan to work at a level that will trigger payments from Social Security to the EN.

What if an EN will not accept my TTW?

You can still receive free services through your local Career Center or state vocational rehabilitation (VR) program. Also, if you have a mental health diagnosis and are eligible to receive MaineCare case management or behavioral health home services, you may qualify to work with an Employment Specialist with the Community Employment Services project. Call the number on the left for more information.

Will the EN help me go back to school?

The EN receives payments from Social Security only when you're working. ENs usually do **not** assist with school plans. But VR might, and there are other resources such as PASS, a Family Development Account, and Federal Student Aid.

What are other benefits of using my TTW?

Social Security won't do a medical Continuing Disability Review (CDR) if your TTW is assigned and you are making progress toward your employment goal.
